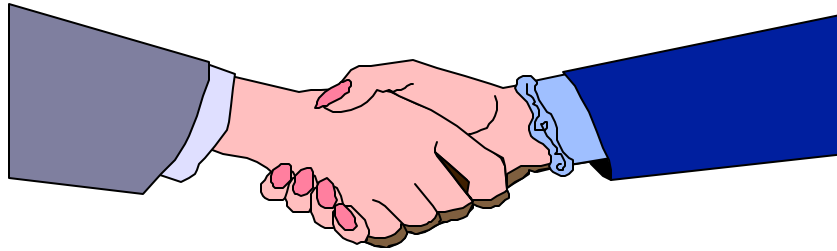

## **CHAPTER-I**

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- 1.1 The present Employment Review is twenty-ninth in the series of Annual Employment Reviews being published by the Directorate General of Employment and Training (DGE&T), Ministry of Labour, Government of India, and pertains to the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 1998. This Review is based on the information collected by the network of Employment Exchanges in the country under the Employment Market Information (EMI) Programme of the DGE&T, which was initiated more than thirty-eight years ago.

### **COVERAGE OF EMI PROGRAMME**

- 1.2 The EMI Programme relates to the “Organised Sector” of our economy. This organised sector covers all establishments in the Public Sector, irrespective of their size and non-agricultural establishments in the Private Sector employing 10 or more persons. Information in respect of all the Public Sector establishments and non-agricultural establishments in the Private Sector employing 25 or more persons is collected statutorily under the provisions of the Employment Exchanges (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act, 1959 and information from smaller non-agricultural establishments in the Private Sector employing 10-24 persons is collected on voluntary basis.

### **ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR**

- 1.3 There were 2.81 lakh establishments on the Employer’s Register of Employment Exchanges at the end of March 1998. Of these 1.67 lakh were in the Public Sector and remaining 1.14 lakh in Private Sector. There was marginal increase in the number of establishments both in the Public and Private Sectors. It has registered an overall increase of 1.0% over the previous year. The Public Sector establishments increased from 1.65 lakh at the end of March 1997 to 1.67 lakh at the end of March 1998 recording an increase of 0.9%. All branches of Public Sector recorded increase in the number of establishments except Central Government recorded a decrease of 4.4%. The increase of establishments in the Private Sector was of the order of 1.1%. The increase of larger establishments was recorded as 1.2%, and in the case of smaller establishments increase was 1.1%.

### **EMPLOYMENT IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR**

- 1.4 Employment in the organised sector goes down from 285.18 lakh in March 1997 to 281.51 lakh in March 1998 recording a decrease of 1.3%. However, during the preceding year 1996-97 there was an increase of the order 2.7%. The Private Sector employment recorded an increase of 0.8% where as Public Sector employment showed decrease of 2.2%. The increase of 0.8% in Private Sector employment during the period under review 1997-98 was lower as compared to 1.7% recorded in the previous year 1996-97. In the Public Sector decrease of 2.2% in employment was recorded during the period.

- 1.5 Under report 1997-98 as against an increase of 3.1% during the corresponding period of the previous year 1996-97.

### **EMPLOYMENT IN DIFFERENT ZONES/REGIONS.**

- 1.6 During the year under review 1997-98, all zones/regions except Andaman & Nicobar Islands Northern and Southern Zones of the country recorded negative growth in employment. The Andaman & Nicobar Islands (which is outside the scheme of Zonal Classification) recorded the highest growth in Employment (2.9%) followed by Southern Zone (0.5%) and Northern Zone (0.3%). The maximum decrease in employment was recorded in Eastern Zone (5.9%) followed by North-Eastern Zone (5.0%) Central Zone (0.5%) and Western (0.5%).

### **EMPLOYMENT IN DIFFERENT INDUSTRY DIVISIONS.**

- 1.7 During 1997-98, as would be observed from results shown in Table 11, there was decrease in employment in most industry divisions. The maximum decrease in employment was recorded in Industry Division Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry and Fishing (4.6%), followed by Manufacturing (3.9%) Transport, Storage and Communication (0.9%), Mining and Quarrying (0.6%) and Financing, Insurance, Real Estate and Business Services (0.2%). The increase in employment was recorded in Whole Sale and Retail Trade and Restaurants and Hotels (0.8%), followed by Electricity, Gas and Water (0.3%), Construction (0.3%) and Community, Social and Personal Services (0.1%).

### **WOMEN EMPLOYMENT**

- 1.7 Employment of women in the organised sector went up from 47.16 lakh in March 1997 to 47.80 lakh in March, 1998 registering an increase of 1.4%. Women's employment in the Public Sector recorded an increase of 0.9% during the year under report (1997-98), whereas in the Private Sector the increase was 2.0%. In absolute terms, the number of women employees in the Public Sector went up from 27.34 lakh in March, 1997 to 27.59 lakh in March, 1998 and in the case of Private Sector their number increased from 19.82 lakh in March, 1997 to 20.21 lakh in March, 1998.

### **WORK-SEEKERS**

- 1.8 The number of work-seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges in the country had gone up from 376.31 lakh at the end of March 1997 to 391.87 lakh at the end of March 1998 recording an increase of 4.1%. The number of educated job seekers (Matriculates and above) increased from 272.82 lakh at the end of December 1997 to 277.89 lakh at the end of December 1998.

## **EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES**

- 1.9 The number of vacancies notified to the employment Exchanges by various employers in the country during January-December, 1998 was only 3.59 lakh as against 3.93 lakh vacancies notified during January-December, 1997. A fall in the proportion of vacancies notified to registrations effected at the employment exchanges by various employers over the last ten years from 9.1% in 1989 to 6.2% in 1998 appears to be an alarming feature indicating dis-popularity of the services of Employment Exchanges resulting in decrease of placement effected to registrations which went down from 4.4% in 1989 to 4.0% in 1998 as is evident from data in Table 27.

## CHAPTER-II

### THE ECONOMIC SCENARIO 1997-98

- 2.1 The overall economic growth of GDP has decelerated significantly to 5% in 1997-98 from 7.5% in 1996-97. There has also been a fall in the average rate of inflation during 1997-98 to less than 5% from 6.3% during 1996-97. The average rate of growth of the economy rose from 6% per annum in the Seventh Plan (1985-90) to 6.8% in Eighth Plan (1992-97). Growth averaged a high of 7.5% per annum in the last three years of the Eighth Plan (1994-95 to 1996-97). The drop in GDP growth in 1997-98 is attributable mainly to a sharp fall in the growth rate in agriculture and a deceleration in the growth of Industry. The service sector posted a robust growth of 8.9% in 1997-98.
- 2.2 The growth slow down can be traced to a combination of underlying supply factors and temporary demand factors. The former are associated primarily with the quantity, quality and cost of basic infrastructure services such as Power, Railways and Roads (and to a lesser extent posts, airports and telecom). The demand slow-down is attributable to several factors including the sharp deceleration in exports since 1996-97, substantial uncertainty in domestic and International environments, tightening of money-credit policies in 1995-96 and other cyclical factors. The reduction in the domestic investment-saving gap during 1996-97 and the extremely low inflation rate during 1997-98 support such a demand side explanation. Some signs of recovery are however, observable in the sharp rise in sanctions and disbursements of All India Financial Institutions, and the rise in stock market prices during March and April 1998.
- 2.3 Total gross domestic savings reached an all time high of 26.1% of GDP at current Market Prices in 1996-97. This rise in domestic savings was primarily due to a rise in Private Savings. As a proportion of GDP Private Savings increased from 23% in 1995-96 to a Peak of 24.2% in 1996-97. High growth in GDP, low rates of inflation and the array of economic and financial measures undertaken over the past few years, were some of the casual factors. The composition of household sector savings shows a substantial shift towards financial savings, which as a proportion of GDP, increased by 2.1 percent points to 10.7% in 1996-97 (from 8.6% of GDP in 1995-96) on the other hand, household savings in physical assets as a proportion of GDP have declined from 10.3% in 1995-96 to 9.6% in 1996-97.
- 2.4 Gross domestic capital formation as a proportion of GDP at current market prices has continued to surge ahead of gross domestic savings rate to attain a high of 27.3% in 1996-97. Similarly, gross domestic capital formation in real terms as a proportion of GDP at constant Prices reached a level of 27.4% in 1996-97. This convergence in the rate of gross domestic capital formation at current and constant prices reflects a significant improvement in relative prices of capital goods vis-à-vis other goods and services.

2.5 Real gross fixed investment as a proportion of GDP at constant prices declined marginally from 24% in 1995-96 to 23.8% in 1996-97. This was accompanied by a sharp decline in the contribution of real stock accumulation to 1.5% of GDP in 1996-97 from 3.4% in 1995-96. Nevertheless, real gross fixed capital formation in the Private Sector rose above 17% of GDP in 1996-97.

## **SPECIAL EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMMES**

- 2.6 Special Employment Programmes like Employment Assurance Scheme (EAS), Integrated Rural Development Programme (IRDP), Training of Rural Youth for Self Employment (TRYSEM), Jawahar Rozgar Yojana (JRY), Nehru Rozgar Yojana (NRY), Prime Minister's Rozgar Yojana (PMRY), the scheme of development of Women and Children in Rural Areas (DWCRA) and the Swarna Jayanti Shahari Rozgar Yojana (SJSRY) have been further strengthened to ensure generation of more employment, creation of productive assets, imparting of technical, entrepreneurial skills and raising the income level of the very poor.
- 2.7 The Employment Assurance Scheme (EAS) has been universalized so as to make it applicable to all the rural blocks of the country in two phases. An amount of Rs. 225 Crore has been released to new blocks covered under the scheme during 1997-98. The other objective of EAS is the creation of economic infrastructure and community assets for sustained employment for 100 days of unskilled manual work in the EAS blocks to the rural poor.
- 2.8 The Jawahar Rozgar Yojana (JRY) aims at generation of additional gainful employment for the unemployed and under-employed men & women in the rural areas, strengthening of rural economic infrastructure and assets and improvement in the overall quality of life in rural areas. From 1997-98 funds to the tune of 15% under JRY have been allocated to intermediate level Panchayat Samities and are now distributed among Gram Panchayat Samities and District Rural Development Agencies/Zila Parishads in the ratio of 70:15:15. The JRY has since been restructured and streamlined. As a result of this, the Indira Awas Yojana (IAY) and Million Wells Scheme (MWS) which were earlier sub schemes under JRY have now become separate programmes with effect from 1.1.96. The sub-scheme under JRY called intensive JRY (IJRY) has been abolished and Employment Assurance Scheme (EAS) has been extended to the areas where IJRY was being implemented. Since 1989 under JRY Scheme 6861 Million man days of employment were generated.
- 2.9 The objective of the Integrated Rural Development Programme (IRDP) is to provide income-generating assets to identified families below the Poverty line through a mix of credit and subsidy to enable them to improve their income levels and to eventually cross the poverty line. It is stipulated that at least 50% of the assisted families should belong to the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe categories, with corresponding flow of resources to them. It is also required that at least 40% of those assisted should be women under this Programme.
- 2.10 The main objective of Training of Rural Youth for Self-Employment (TRYSEM) is to train rural youth from the target group of families in skills, so as to enable them to take up self/wage employment. The trainees are given stipends and free tool kits. It has been laid down that the coverage of youth from SC and ST Communities should be at least 50% of the rural youths trained.

- 2.11 The scheme of Development of Women and Children in Rural Areas (DWCRA) aims to improve the socio-economic status of the poor women in the rural areas through creation of opportunities, for income generating activities on a self-sustaining basis.
- 2.12 The Nehru Rozgar Yojana (NRY) aims at providing employment opportunities for the urban poor. The provision of Rs. 31 Crore for 1997-98 (RE) includes expenditure on its three components viz, Wage Employment, Micro-Enterprises and Shelter up gradation for the urban poor. The Programme of urban basic services for the poor seeks to provide an integrated package of social services by creating neighborhood committees of the residents at the slum level. As on 30.11.1997 over 8200 neighborhood Development Committees comprising primarily urban poor women have been set up in 360 towns taken up for provision of basic services all over the country. The Prime Minister's Integrated Urban Poverty Eradication Programme (PMIUPEP) envisages a holistic approach to urban poverty eradication by creating a facilitating environment for significant improvement in the quality of life of the urban poor.
- 2.13 The Swarna Jyanti Shahari Rozgar Yojana (SJSRY), which came in to operation from 1.12.1997, shall seek to provide gainful employment to the urban unemployed or under employed poor through encouraging the setting up of self-employment ventures or provision of wage employment. It shall be funded on a 75:25 basis between center and states. It shall consist of two special schemes i.e. the urban self-employment programme and the urban wage employment Programme. The scheme gives a special impetus to empowering and uplifting the poor women and launches a special Programme, namely, Development of Women and Children in urban areas under which groups of urban poor women setting up self-employment ventures are eligible for subsidy up to 50% of the Project cost.
- 2.14 Prime Minister's Rozgar Yojana (PMRY) for providing self-employment to educated unemployed youth has been designed to provide employment to more than a million persons by setting up of seven lakh Micro enterprises. A target of 2.20 lakh beneficiaries has been fixed for 1997-98. By the end of December 1997 1,01,812 cases have been sanctioned loans. The existing scheme for self-employment for educated unemployed youth will be subsumed in PMRY.

2.15 The targets and achievements of the Special Employment Programmes are given in Table –2

## **CHAPTER-III**

### **EMPLOYMENT MARKET INFORMATION PROGRAMME**

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- 3.1 The main objectives of the Employment Market Information (EMI) Programme are: -
- I) to provide information at short intervals about the structure of employment in the public and private sectors at the area, state and national levels and also to monitor the changes in the level of employment.
  - II) to present occupational composition and educational profile of employees in the public and private sector establishments.
  - III) to identify the occupations which are characteristic to a given industry.
  - IV) to assess the manpower shortages in the organised sector.
  - V) to make available information required to improve and add to the services offered by the National Employment Service.
  - VI) to monitor the progress in generating employment during the five year Plans.

#### **COVERAGE**

- 3.2 The EMI programme was initiated in the year 1955 as a Pilot Project in Delhi, which was subsequently extended to selected areas (Districts) in various States during the Second Five-Year Plan period. The Programme was provided a statutory base with the enactment of the Employment Exchanges (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) EE (CNV) Act 1959. The data collected under the EMI programme covers only the Organised Sector of the economy which inter-alia covers all establishments in the Public Sector irrespective of their size and non-agricultural establishments in the Private Sector employing 10 or more persons. While the information from non-agricultural establishments in the Private Sector employing 25 or more persons is collected under the provisions of EE (CNV) Act 1959, data from the establishments employing 10-24 persons is collected on a voluntary basis.
- 3.3 Under the EMI programme collection of data is done following the “establishment reporting system”. The establishments are required to furnish at regular intervals details about the number of persons they employ by sex, vacancies that have occurred and the type of persons, which are in short supply. This information relates only to ‘Employers’ and ‘Employees’. Employers include Owners, Proprietors, Managers, Working Partners, or Directors of Firms/Companies who work full time for the firms/companies.

## **GEOGRAPHICAL COVERAGE**

- 3.4 The EMI Programme is being implemented in all the States and Union Territories of the country except Arunachal Pradesh, Sikkim, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep. The programme could not be extended to these States/UTs so far due to administrative reasons. The smaller establishments employing 10-24 persons in the Private Sector in metropolitan areas of greater Mumbai and Calcutta are also not being covered owing to administrative reasons.

## **REFERENCE PERIOD**

- 3.5 The EMI data are furnished by the establishments through ER-I and ER-II returns. The form ER-I is used for the collection of information from the establishments at quarterly intervals i.e. 31<sup>st</sup> March, 30<sup>th</sup> June, 30 September and 31<sup>st</sup> December of each year.

## **ORGANISATION OF THE PROGRAMME**

- 3.6 The information collected through ER-I is scrutinised, tabulated and disseminated at the area, state and national level. The employment exchanges prepare Area Employment Market Reviews to indicate employment situation in the organised sector within the district. The State Directors of Employment also prepare state level Employment Reviews showing employment situation prevailing at the State level. At the National level, Employment Reviews are prepared annually by the Directorate General of Employment and Training projecting the overall picture of Employment in the organised sector in different States/UTs. The present Employment Review provides information regarding employment in the organised sector at the end of the year 1997-98. The National Industrial Classification (NIC) 1987 was followed in classifying the employment data by industries.

## **LIMITATIONS OF EMI DATA**

- 3.7 **The EMI Programme does not cover: -**
- a) Employment in the un-organized sector.
  - b) Self Employment
  - c) Part-time employment
  - d) Employment in agricultural and allied establishments, which furnish employment returns only on voluntary basis.
  - e) Employment in household Sector and non-agricultural establishments employing less than 10 workers in Private Sector.
  - f) Employment in Defence forces.
  - g) Employment in Indian Embassies and Missions abroad.

Other limitations of EMI Programme are: -

- a) The frame of establishments maintained at local employment exchange is not comprehensive in certain cases due to non-inclusion of new and emerging establishments.
- b) There is an element of estimation of employment in respect of non-responding establishments.
- c) Employment created under various employment/beneficiary-oriented schemes/programmes viz. NREP, RLEGP, IRDP, TRYSEM. etc. might be erroneously reported under the EMI Programme.

### **COVERAGE OF ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR AT THE END OF MARCH, 1998.**

- 3.8 On the basis of information furnished by the Directorates of Employment in various States/Union Territories, there were 2,81145 establishments borne on the Employers' Register as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1998. Of these, the required employment returns were rendered by 2,09103 establishments both in the Public and Private Sectors. The rate of response works out to 74.4% during the year 1997-98 as against 74.9% achieved during the last year i.e. 1996-97.
- 3.9 The coverage of Public Sector comprises establishments of Central Government, State Government, Quasi Government (Central), Quasi Government (State) and Local Bodies. In the Private Sector, the establishments are grouped on the basis of the number of persons employed therein. Establishments employing 25 or more persons are categorised as larger establishments and those employing 10-24 persons are termed as smaller establishments.

- 3.10 It is observed from the above table that out of the total number of 166622 establishments in the public sector 77.3% rendered the returns whereas in the private sector out of 114523 establishments 70.2 % rendered the returns. The analysis of the rate of response reveals that in the public sector the highest number (78.9%) of establishments in Local Bodies rendered the employment return, followed by State Govt. (77.9%). Quasi Govt. (State) (77.5%) Quasi-Govt. (Central) (76.4%) and Central Govt. establishments (71.8%). In the Private Sector, 74.1% of the Larger Establishments and 66.6 % of the Smaller Establishments had sent the employment returns for the period ending March, 1998

## BRANCHWISE & SIZEWISE DISTRIBUTION OF ESTABLISHMENTS

- 3.11 Table-4 below presents the distribution of establishments by different branches of public and private sectors as on 31st March 1997 and 1998

- 3.12 It is seen from the above Table that there was increase in the number of establishments in all the branches of the public sector and private sector except Central Government where the number of establishments decreased (4.4%) during the year 1997-98. A graphical representation of number of establishments in the organised sector is given in the next page.

**COVERAGE OF ESTABLISHMENTS IN DIFFERENT ZONES / REGIONS :**

3.13 The entire country has been divided into six Zones / Regions, viz., Northern Zone, Central Zone, Eastern Zone, North-Eastern Zone, Western Zone and Southern Zone. The Andaman & Nicobar Islands is outside the scheme of Zonal Councils embodied in the States Reorganisation Act, 1956. Table-5 below shows the number of establishments in the six zones and in the Union Territories of A & N Islands in 1997 and 1998.

3.14 The above Table reveals that the maximum percentage increase of establishments in the organised sector over the previous year was recorded in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands which is outside the scheme of zonal classification (5.2%), but in absolute term the increase was marginal i.e. 192 to 202, whereas the total number of establishments had shown marginal increase (1.0%). The increase in the number of establishments over the previous year was recorded in all the zones, except Central Zone and Northern-Eastern Zone where the decrease in the number of establishments was recorded (0.8%) and (0.1%) respectively. There was a marginal increase in other zones, Southern Zone (1.8%), Western Zone (1.4%), Eastern Zone (1.3%) and Northern Zone (0.9%). The number of establishments according to the State/Union Territories is contained in Annexure-I.

**ESTABLISHMENTS COVERED IN DIFFERENT INDUSTRIES/ SERVICES:**

3.15 The distribution of establishments in the organised sector by Industrial Divisions in 1997 and 1998 is shown in Table-6 below:

3.16 The Tertiary and Secondary sectors showed marginal increase of 1.4% and 0.1% respectively whereas the primary sector showed a decline of 0.3% in the number of establishments over the previous year 1997. The Community, Social & Personal Services and Financing, Insurance Real Estate and Business Services division in the Tertiary Sector recorded the highest growth of (1.7%) and (1.1%) respectively, whereas Transport, Storage and Communication division in the same sector recorded decline in number of establishments (1.2%) over the previous year 1997. In the Secondary Sector the number of Establishments increased in Electricity Gas and Water Division (1.0%) and in Construction Division (0.8%). In the Primary Sector both industry divisions namely Mining & Quarrying and Agriculture, Hunting Forestry & Fishing recorded a decrease of (0.8%) and (0.2%) respectively in the number of establishments over the previous year 1997. The number of establishments in the Public & Private sectors classified by Industry Groups is given in Annexure-II.

## CHAPTER –IV

### EMPLOYMENT IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR

- 4.1 During the year under review (1997-98), employment in the organised sector showed decrease of 1.3%. There was an increase of 2.7% in the employment during the preceding year (1996-97). In absolute terms, employment in the organised sector decreased from 285.18 lakhs at the end of March 1997 to 281.51 lakhs at the end of March 1998.
- 4.2 The sector-wise break-up of employment as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1997 and 1998 and percentage variation in 1998 over 1997 is shown in the following Table.

It is revealed from the data contained in the Table-7 above that employment in the public sector recorded decrease of 2.2% in 1998 over the year 1997. Private sector employment has shown an increase of 0.8% during the same period. A graphical representation of Employment in the organised sector (Public & Private) as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1997 & 1998 is given on the next page.

## **EMPLOYMENT IN DIFFERENT BRANCHES OF PUBLIC SECTOR :**

An analysis of employment in different branches of the public sector revealed that the decrease in employment was recorded in all the branches of Public Sector except Central Govt. and Quasi-Govt. (State) which recorded marginal increase (0.2%) and (0.1%) respectively. The maximum decrease was recorded in Quasi-Govt. (Central) (9.2%), followed by Local Bodies (1.9%), and State Govt. (0.6%). A graphical representation showing Employment in the different branches of Public Sector and Private Sector by size of establishment as on 31.3.98 is given on the next page.

## **EMPLOYMENT IN PRIVATE SECTOR :**

4.4 Employment in the private sector is classified by size of establishments. On this basis, the break-up of employment in the private sector by size of establishments is shown in the following Table-9.

It may be observed from the Table-9 that employment in larger and smaller establishments in the private sector went up by 0.7% and 1.2% respectively. The overall increase in employment in the Private Sector was of the order of 0.8% during the period under review.

Table-10 reveals that the maximum increase in Employment in percentages in the country was recorded in Andaman & Nicobar Island, which is out side the scheme of Zonal classification. Whereas Southern Zone & Northern Zone recorded marginal increase in employment (0.5%) and (0.3%) respectively over the previous year 1997. The maximum decrease in Employment was recorded in Eastern Zone (5.9%) followed by North-Eastern Zone (5.0%) The decrease in employment was marginal in Central Zone and Western zone (0.5%) in each Zone.

## **CHAPTER-V**

### **EMPLOYMENT IN STATES AND UNION TERRITORIES**

- 5.1 Employment in the organised sector in the country is spread over 27 States/Union Territories. Analysis of data with regard to employment in the organised sector by different Zones/Regions has already been made in Chapter IV. Each Zone/Region has a group of contiguous States/Union Territories. The main focus of analysis is on the trends of employment in the organised sector in various States/Union Territories under each Zone/Region. Employment in different States/Union Territories under each of the six Zones is shown in Annexure III.

#### **NORTHERN ZONE**

##### **Haryana**

- 5.2 Total Employment in the State had marginally declined from 6.67 lakh in March 1997 to 6.58 lakh in March 1998 recording a decrease of 1.3%. Employment decreased from 2.42 lakh to 2.33 lakh i.e. 3.7% in the Private Sector and remained static in the Public Sector in the state during the period under review (1997-98). Haryana state had a share of only 2.3% of the total employment as at the end of March 1998.

##### **Punjab**

- 5.3 Employment in the State increased from 8.36 lakh to 8.47 lakh in March 1998 showing an increase of 1.3%. Employment in Public Sector increased from 5.87 lakh to 5.99 lakh i.e. 2.0% where as Private Sector recorded decrease from 2.49 lakh to 2.48 lakh (0.4%). The share of employment in Punjab was 3.0% of the total employment in the organized sector at the end of March 1998.

##### **Himachal Pradesh**

- 5.4 Employment in the State increased from 2.83 lakh to 2.93 lakh in March 1998 showing an increase of 3.5%. Employment had increased both in Public and Private Sectors 3.3% and 4.9% respectively during the period under review (1997-98). Himachal Pradesh had a share of 1.0% in All India employment at the end of March 1998.

##### **Chandigarh**

- 5.5 Employment in the Union Territory had increased from 0.81 lakh at the end of March, 1997 to 0.83 lakh at the end of March 1998 recording an increase of 2.5%. Employment in both public & private sectors also increased by (1.6%) and (5.6%) respectively. The Union Territory contributed only 0.3% of the total organised sector employment at the all-India level.

## **Delhi**

- 5.6 Employment in the Union Territory had marginal increased from 8.42 lakh at the end of March 1997 to 8.45 lakh at the end of March 1998, reflecting an increase of 0.4% in the organised sector. In the public sector the employment increased by 0.8% while in the private sector it went down by 0.9%. The Union Territory contributed 3.0% to the total organised sector employment at the all India level.

## **Rajasthan**

- 5.7 Employment in the State decreased from 12.80 lakh in March 1997 to 12.73 lakh in March 1998 showing a decrease of 0.5%. In public sector, employment decreased by 0.6% whereas private sector employment decreased by 0.4%. The share of the State in all-India employment was 4.5% as at the end of March, 1998.

## **Jammu & Kashmir**

- 5.8 Employment in the state increased from 2.09 lakh to 2.13 lakh in March 1998 showing an increase of 1.9%. Employment had increased both in Public & Private Sectors 1.5% and 10.0% respectively during the period under review (1997-98). The state had a share of 0.7% of all-India employment at the end of March 1998.

## **CENTRAL ZONE**

### **Madhya Pradesh**

- 5.9 Total employment in Madhya Pradesh decreased from 16.74 lakh in March 1997 to 16.52 lakh in March 1998 recording a decrease of 1.3%. Public Sector employment had gone down from 14.20 lakh to 14.05 lakh registering a fall of 1.1% as well as Private Sector also recorded decrease in Employment (2.8%). The State had a share of 5.9% of all-India employment in March 1998.

### **Uttar Pradesh**

- 5.10 Organised Sector Employment in the State remained static in March 1998 as compared to March 1997. Employment in the Public Sector went down by 0.5% while in Private Sector employment recorded an increase by (2.3%). The state accounted for a share of 9.3% of all-India employment as at the end of March 1998.

## **NORTH-EASTERN ZONE**

### **Assam**

5.11 Organised Sector Employment in the State had decreased from 11.44 lakh in March 1997 to 10.43 lakh in March 1998, recording a decrease of 8.8%. Employment in both Public & Private Sectors decreased by 9.2% and 8.5% respectively. The state had a share of 3.7% of all-India employment.

### **Meghalaya**

5.12 Total Employment in the State had marginally declined from 0.80 lakh in March, 1997 to 0.79 lakh in March 1998 recording a decrease of 1.3%. Employment decreased from (0.72 lakh) to (0.71 lakh) i.e. 1.4% in Public Sector and remained static in the Private Sector. The State's share at the end of March, 1998 in all India employment was only 0.3%.

### **Manipur**

5.13 Organised sector employment in the State had increased from 0.79 lakh at the end of March 1997 to 0.80 lakh at the end of March 1998, recording a nominal increase of 1.3%. Employment increased from 0.77 lakh to 0.78 lakh i.e. 1.3% in Public Sector and remained static in Private Sector. Manipur had a meager share of 0.3% in the total organized sector employment in the country.

### **Mizoram**

5.14 Employment in the State had increased from 0.40 lakh in March, 1997 to 0.41 lakh at the end of March, 1998 recording an increase of 2.5%. In the public sector employment had gone up from 0.39 lakh in 1997 to 0.40 lakh in 1998 showing an increase of 2.6%. In the private sector, the employment more or less remained static during the year. The State's share in all-India organised sector employment was only 0.1%.

### **Nagaland**

5.15 Employment in the state had increased from 0.74 lakh in March 1997 to 0.76 lakh at the end of March, 1998 recording an increase of (2.7%). In the Public Sector Employment had gone up from 0.71 lakh to 0.73 lakh showing an increase of 2.8%. In the Private Sector the Employment more or less remained static during the year. Nagaland had a small share of 0.3% in the total organised sector employment in the country.

### **Tripura**

5.16 Employment in the state increased from 1.11 lakh to 1.33 lakh in March 1998 showing an increase of 19.8%. Employment had increase both in Public & Private Sectors 20.0% and 18.2% respectively during the period under Review (1997-98) Tripura contributed only 0.5% in the total organized sector employment at all-India level.

## EASTERN ZONE

### Bihar

5.17 Employment in the organised sector in the State had decreased from 16.31 lakh in March 1997 to 16.17 lakh in March 1998 showing a decrease of 0.9%. There was a decrease of Employment in Public sector to the extent of 1.3% where as employment in Private Sector increased by 1.6%. The organised sector employment in the State as a whole formed 5.7% of the total employment in the organised sector at the all-India level.

### Orissa

5.18 Total employment in the organised sector in the State decreased from 8.12 lakh in March 1997 to 8.00 lakh in March 1998, recording a decrease of 1.5%. Employment in the public sector decreased by 2.4% but increased in the private sector by 5.6%. The share of the State was 2.8% in the total organised sector employment in the country.

### West Bengal

5.19 The organised sector employment in the State recorded a decrease from 25.74 lakh in March 1997 to 23.05 lakh in March 1998, recording a decrease of 10.5%. Employment in Public sector went down by 16.3% but increased in the Private sector by 3.1%. Public & Private sector employment constituted 7.8% and 9.1% respectively of the all-India employment in these sectors. The overall employment in the State accounted for 8.2% of the total organised sector employment at the all-India level.

## WESTERN ZONE

### Gujarat

5.20 Employment in the organised sector in the State was 17.88 lakh in March, 1998 as compared to 17.71 lakh in March 1997. The increase in the organised sector employment was 1.0% during the year under review. In Private sector increase in employment was 2.1% where as in Public Sector employment remained static. The total organised sector employment in the State accounted for 6.3% of the total employment in the organised sector at the all-India level.

### Maharashtra

5.21 Employment in the organised sector in the State decreased from 38.93 lakh in March 1997 to 38.46 lakh in March 1998 showing a decrease of 1.2%. In the private sector the increase in Employment was 0.7% whereas employment in Pubic Sector decreased by 2.4% during the year under review. Public and private sector had a share of 12.0% and 17.3% respectively of total employment in the respective sectors, whereas total organised sector employment in the State constituted 13.7% of the total organised sector employment at the all-India level during the year under review.

## **Goa**

5.22 Total employment in the state had marginally increased from 1.07 lakh in March 1997 to 1.08 lakh in March 1998 recording an increase of 0.9%. Employment in Private sector increased by 2.6% where as in Public Sector Employment remained static. The state accounted for only 0.4% of the total organised sector employment at the All-India level.

## **Daman & Diu**

5.23 The total organised sector employment in the Union Territory of Daman had gone up from 10 thousand in March 1997 to 12 thousand in March 1998 showing an increase of 20%. The increase in employment in private sector was 25% where as employment in Public Sector remained static.

## **SOUTHERN ZONE**

### **Andhra Pradesh**

5.24 Employment in the organised sector in the State had gone up from 20.41 lakh in March 1997 to 20.52 lakh in March 1998 recording an increase of 0.5%. The employment growth was 0.1% and 1.9% in the public & private sectors respectively. In the all India Employment figures, the State accounted for 7.8% and 6.2% in the public and private sector respectively and 7.3% in the total organised sector employment in the country.

### **Karnataka**

5.25 Organised sector employment in the State went up from 18.23 lakh in March 1997 to 18.38 lakh in March 1998 showing a rise of 0.8%. Employment had increased in Private sector by 2.7% where as in Public sector employment decreased by 0.5%. The share of Karnataka was 5.6% and 8.6% in all-India public and private sector employment respectively and 6.5% in the total organised sector employment at the all-India level.

### **Kerala**

5.26 The total organised sector employment in the state went up from 11.79 lakh in March, 1997 to 12.10 lakh in March 1998 showing a rise of 2.6% Employment in the public sector & private sector, however, had gone up by 0.2% and 5.4% respectively. Kerala contributed 3.2% and 6.6% in public and private sector respectively and 4.3% in the total organised sector employment at the all India level.

### **Pondicherry**

5.27 The total employment in the organised sector increased from 51 thousand to 52 thousand showing a rise of 2% in the Union Territory during the period under review. No change in public sector employment was recorded. Where as in private sector employment recorded an increase of 9.1%. The overall employment in the Union Territory was 0.2% of the all-India employment in the organised sector.

## **Tamil Nadu**

5.28 Among the Southern states, Employment in Tamil Nadu was the highest. In this state, organised sector employment went down from 25.70 lakh in March, 1997 to 25.52 lakh in March, 1998 indicating a decrease of 0.7%. The employment decreased in both public & private sectors by 0.9% and 0.3% respectively. The proportion of organised sector employment as a whole to all-India employment was 9.0% during the year under review.

## **Andaman & Nicobar Islands**

5.29 The Union Territory is outside the Zonal classification as per the States Reorganisation Act. Total employment in the organised sector increased from 35 thousand to 36 thousand showing a rise of 2.9%. No change in Public Sector employment was recorded. Whereas in Private Sector employment recorded an increase from 3 thousand to 4 thousand showing increase by 33.3%. The Union Territory accounted for less than 0.2% of the total organised sector employment at the All-India level.

## CHAPTER-VI

### EMPLOYMENT IN INDUSTRIES/SERVICES

6.1 A broad picture about the structure of employment in the organised sector, in different Industries/Services grouped under Primary, Secondary and Tertiary Sectors as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1997 and 1998 is presented in the following Table: -

It will be observed from the above Table-11 that Primary Sector comprising Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing and Mining & Quarrying Industry Division showed an over-all decrease of 2.9% in employment. Under this sector, Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry and Fishing recorded a decrease of 4.6%, whereas the Mining & Quarrying Division recorded a decrease of 0.6%.

- 6.2 An over-all decrease in employment in Secondary sector was 3.4%. Under this Sector, employment in Electricity, Gas and Water and Construction Division showed an increase of 0.3% each and Manufacturing Division showed decline of 3.9%.
- 6.3 There was an overall decrease in employment in the Tertiary sector of 0.1%. In this sector a nominal growth of 0.8% in employment was recorded in Wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels followed by 0.1% in Community, Social & Personal Services while Transport, Storage & Communication and Financing, Insurance, Real Estate & Business Services division recorded decrease in Employment (0.9%) and 0.2% respectively. Employment in the organised sector by Industry Divisions under public and private sectors as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1997 and 1998 is shown in Annexure-VI. A graphical representation on 31.3.98 is given on previous page.

#### **EMPLOYMENT IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS BY MAJOR INDUSTRY DIVISION AND BRANCH/SIZE OF ESTABLISHMENTS.**

- 6.4 The data on employment classified by Industry Division and branches of Public Sector and Act and Non-Act establishments in the Private Sector as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1997 and 1998 are contained in Annexure V. Branch-Wise distribution of employment in Public Sector shows that under Central Govt. some Industry Divisions recorded increase in employment. The maximum increase in employment was recorded in Mining & Quarrying (92.1%) followed by Community, Social & Personal Services (6.7%), Wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels (5.2%) and Manufacturing (2.7%) while other Industry divisions showed decrease in employment. The maximum decrease was in Financing, Insurance Real Estate Business Services (22.1%) and Agriculture, Hunting Forestry & Fishing (20.3%).
- 6.5 Under the State Govt., the maximum increase in employment was recorded in Industry Division Financing, Insurance, Real Estate & Business Services (3.7%) followed by Electricity, Gas & Water (2.7%), Transport, Storage and Communication (2.0%), and Mining & Quarrying (1.9%). Industry Division Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing and Wholesale & Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels showed no change in employment, whereas Manufacturing and Community, Social & Personal Services showed marginal decline (0.7%) each followed by Construction which recorded a decrease of 0.4%.
- 6.6 In the Central Govt. (Quasi), employment in all Industry Divisions recorded decreasing trend except Wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels. The maximum decrease in employment was recorded in Manufacturing (27.9%) followed by Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing (14.7), Transport, Storage and Communication (3.0%), Electricity, Gas and Water (2.7%) and Community, Social & Personal Services (1.3%). Other remaining Industry Divisions, showed decrease in employment less than 1%. There was an overall decrease of 9.2% in the Central Govt. (Quasi) during the period under review.

- 6.7 In the State Govt. (Quasi) Employment growth was recorded in the Industry Transport, Storage and Communication (3.0%) followed by Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing and Manufacturing (1.4%) each and marginal increase in Wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurant, Hotels (0.8%) and Electricity Gas & Water (0.2%). There was a decline in employment in Mining & Quarrying (4.3%) followed by Construction (3.5%), Financing, Insurance, Real Estate & Business Services (2.4%) and Community, Social and Personal Services (2.0%). There was an overall increase of (0.1%) in employment in this branch of Public Sector.
- 6.8 Under Local Bodies the maximum increase in employment was registered in Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry and Fishing (7.5%) followed by Wholesale & Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels (6.0%) and Manufacturing (0.1%). There was no change in employment in the industrial division Mining & Quarrying. The employment decreased in Industrial division Financing, Insurance, Real Estate & Business services (11.5%), Construction (3.7%), Transport, Storage & Communication (2.3%), Community, Social & Personal Services (1.9%) and Electricity, Gas & Water (0.4%). There was an overall decrease (1.9%) in employment under local Bodies during the period under Review.
- 6.9 The distribution of employment in the Private Sector, classified by Act and Non-Act Establishments, by Industries/Services Division shows that under Act Establishments, the highest increase in employment was recorded in Construction (32.3%) followed by Financing, Insurance, Real Estate, Business Services (5.1%), Community Social & Personal Services (3.0%), Transport, Storage and Communication (2.5%) and marginal increase in Manufacturing and Wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels (0.6%) and (0.5%) respectively whereas there was no change in employment in Mining & Quarrying. The remaining two Industry Divisions, namely, Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing and Electricity, Gas & Water showed decline of (4.8%), and (0.4%) respectively. So far as Industry-wise composition of employment under Non-Act Establishments in the Private Sector is concerned, the Industry division registered gains in employment in Transport, Storage and Communication (11.6%) followed by Mining & Quarrying (6.8%), Community, Social & Personal Services (4.4%), Manufacturing (3.1%), Financing, Insurance, Real Estate, Business Services (2.8%) and Wholesale and Retail Trade & Restaurants & Hotels (1.5%). On the other hand, the remaining three Industry Divisions under Non-Act Private Sector indicated decline in employment, the maximum being in Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing (42.2%) followed by Electricity Gas and Water (4.1%) and Construction (0.6%).

## **EMPLOYMENT IN KEY INDUSTRIES**

6.10 The organised sector employment in four key industries comprising Coal, Cement, Iron & Steel and Generation and Transmission of Electric Energy is analysed, on the basis of the data contained in the following Table:

The analysis of above data reveals that employment in all above-mentioned key Industries recorded decrease in Employment. The maximum decrease in employment was recorded in Manufacturing of Iron & Steel in Primary semi finished forms by (46.7%) followed by Manufacturing of Cement Lime & Plaster (4.6%). There was marginal decrease in Generation and Transmission of Electric Energy Mining & agglomeration of Coal (0.2%) each.

## **EMPLOYMENT IN TRANSPORT SECTOR**

6.11 Transport industry is an important constituent of employment in the organised Sector. The following Table-13 gives the distribution of employment in Transport Sector.

As may be observed from the data contained in the above Table-13, employment in Inland Water Transport showed a tremendous increase of 56.3% followed by Passenger Transport by bus (including Tramways) by 3.2%. However, employment in Railway Transport decreased by 7.1% followed by Air Transport carriers (of Passengers and Freight) 0.2%. Employment in ocean and costal water Transport sector remained static.

## **EMPLOYMENT IN BANKING AND FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS**

6.12 The employment trends in Banking and Financial Institutions are indicated in Table-14 below:

An analysis of the above data shows that Insurance carriers other than life Industry registered a negative growth of (7.7%) followed by deposit activities (Banking) (0.1%). However, the employment in the Insurance carriers, life and other credit activities increased by 2.8 and 0.9% respectively.

## **EMPLOYMENT IN SERVICES SECTOR**

6.13 Educational services, Research & Scientific Services and Health & Medical Services mainly comprise the services sector. Table 15 below provides Employment data for these services.

Column 5 of the above Table-15 shows that all the services in this sector recorded increase in employment. The highest increase was recorded in Educational Services rendered by Technical or Vocational colleges, Schools and other institutions (3.5%). Followed by Research and Scientific Services (2.3%), Health and Medical services (1.0%) and Educational Services rendered by non-technical colleges, schools etc. (0.6%).

## CHAPTER-VII

### WOMEN'S EMPLOYMENT IN THE ORGANISED SECTOR

7.1 Employment of women constitutes an important component of the organised sector employment in the country. The employment of women in the organised sector has gone up steadily over the last ten years. It comprises 17.0% of the total employment in the organised sector in the country. An overview of women's employment is given in the following Table: -

It may be observed from the above Table that women's employment in the organised sector went up from 35.45 lakh in 1988-89 to 47.80 lakh in 1997-98.

7.2 The increase in women employment during the year 1997-98 was of the order of 1.4% as compared to 4.2% during the preceding year 1996-97. It may be seen from the Table –16 that the share of women’s employment to total employment in the organised sector has risen steadily from 13.7% in 1988-89 to 17.0% in 1997-98.

### **PATTERN OF WOMEN EMPLOYMENT**

7.3 The employment of women in public and private sectors as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 1997 and 1998 and percentage changes between these two years are presented in the following Table-17.

It may be observed from the above Table that out of the total 47.80-lakh women employees in the organised sector at the end of March 1998, 27.59 lakh were in the Public Sector and the remaining 20.21 lakh in the Private Sector. Women’s employment in both public and private sectors registered a growth of 0.9% and 2.0% respectively during the year 1997-98. A graphical representation of women employment in the organised sector (Public & Private) as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1997 & 1998 is given on next page.

The branch-wise distribution of women's employment shows an increase in employment in all branches of Public Sector and Private Sector except marginal decrease in Central Govt.(Quasi) 0.8% in Public Sector. The maximum increase in employment was recorded in Central Govt. (2.3%), State Govt. (Quasi) 2.2%, local bodies (1.3%) and State Govt. 0.7% in Public Sector. There was an overall increase of women's employment in the Public Sector (0.9%) during the period under review. In the Private sector, women's employment registered a growth of (2.5%) in "Larger establishments" whereas "Smaller establishments" recorded negative growth (2.0%). The overall growth in women employment in Private Sector was 2.0% during the period under review.

It may be observed from the above table that women's employment had increased in all Zones of the country except North-Eastern and Central Zone. The highest increase was recorded in Southern Zone (3.0%), followed by Western Zone (1.5%), Northern Zone (1.4%) and Eastern Zone (1.3%) While there is no change in women employment in Andaman & Nicobar Island, (which is out side the scheme of zonal classification). The Women employment in North-Eastern Zone decreased by (4.9%) followed by Central Zone (0.4%).

## WOMEN'S EMPLOYMENT IN STATES/UNION TERRITORIES

7.6 The distribution of women employees by States/U.Ts. Cross-classified by public and private sectors as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1997 and 1998 is contained in Annexure IX. It may be observed that in the States/U.Ts. of Assam (7.6%), Tamil Nadu (1.6%), Bihar (1.2%), Madhya Pradesh (0.5%), Andaman & Nicobar (0.3%), Uttar Pradesh and Haryana (0.2%) each, Women employment had gone down. In all other States/U.Ts. the employment of women showed an upward trend. There was a significant and substantial growth of women employment noticed in Tripura (20.4%), Kerala (9.9%) and Daman & Diu (5.2%), while women's employment had no change in Pondicherry during the period under review (1997-98).

An analysis of data on women's employment contained in Table-20 reveals that there was increase in women's employment in Electricity, Gas & Water (4.9%) followed by Manufacturing (4.2%), Construction (3.3%), Transport storage & Communication Services (2.1%), Community, Social & Personal Services (1.7%) Financial, Insurance, Real Estate & Business Services (1.2%). While there is a decrease in other Industry Divisions, which were Wholesale and Retail Trade and Restaurants & Hotels (6.9%), Agriculture, Hunting, Forestry & Fishing (5.7%) and there was marginal decrease in Mining & Quarrying (0.2%). Sector-wise & Industry-wise women employment is presented in Annexure-X. A graphical representation of women employment in the organised sector by major industries as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1997 & 1998 is given on the next page.

## CHAPTER – VIII

### LABOUR MARKET

- 8.1 Generally, Labour Market is termed as an area where workers in search of employment and employers in need of workers come in contact with each other or meet. This may be local, regional, provincial, national or even inter-national. The proper appraisal of the Labour Market envisages a regular study of the various economic, social, institutional and cultural factors such as quantum and composition of the labour force, level of education, training and skills, behavioral aspects of job-seekers and employers, mobility, recruitment practices, prevailing wage levels, traditions and institutional barriers, etc.
- 8.2 In this Chapter, an attempt has been made to bring together data flowing from day-to-day operations of the National Employment Service relating to work-seekers, vacancies notified, etc. and the Employment Market Information (EMI) Programme of the D.G.E.&T., Ministry of Labour, Government of India regarding the number of persons employed, as both these sets of data taken together have a close bearing on the labour market situation prevailing in our country.
- 8.3 The Employment Exchange statistics provide only a broad indication of the unemployment situation in the organised labour market. Before drawing any conclusions the following limitations of the Employment Exchange statistics as indicators of unemployment in the country must be kept in mind:-
- (i) All persons registered with the Employment Exchanges are not necessarily unemployed. Quite a number of them are already in employment and have registered their names for better and more suitable jobs.
  - (ii) Registrations being voluntary, all unemployed persons do not register themselves with the Employment Exchanges.
  - (iii) Some work-seekers registered at the Employment Exchanges who secure employment subsequently through sources other than the Exchanges do not get their names deregistered.
  - (iv) Many persons residing in rural areas also register themselves with Employment Exchanges but as the Employment Exchanges are located in urban areas the rural registrants are not likely to get properly represented in the Live Register.
  - (v) Many students, who normally are not considered a part of the labour force, also register themselves for employment assistance primarily with a view to gaining seniority in registration.
  - (vi) Some work-seekers register their names with more than one Employment Exchange.

## GENERAL LEVEL OF UNEMPLOYMENT

8.4 On the basis of the data available from the 50<sup>th</sup> Round of the NSS (1993-94), unemployment was estimated to be 11.53 million according to Usual Principal Status (UPS), 14.35 million according to Weekly Status (WS) and 6508 million person days according to Daily Status (DS). As a percentage of the Labour Force, unemployment according to the three concepts works out to 2.56, 4.28 and 6.03 respectively (Table 21). The unemployment rates are much higher for the urban than for the rural areas and for women than for men. For example, unemployment rate according to UPS was 5.21 percent for the urban and 1.79 percent for the rural areas and 8.21% for females and 4.54% for males in the urban. The unemployment rate in the rural area according to UPS for males is more than for females i.e. unemployment rate according to UPS was 1.96 percent for males and 1.40 percent for females.

**UPS-Usual Principal Status:** A person is considered unemployed according to this concept if he/she was available for work but without work for a major part of the year.

**WS-Weekly Status:** A person is considered unemployed according to this concept if he/she though being available for work did not have work even for one hour during the reference week.

**DS-Daily Status:** It is a measure of unemployment in terms of person days of unemployment of all the persons in the Labour force during the reference week.

- 8.5 The absolute magnitude of unemployment has of course, been increasing over the years; but open unemployment rates have also been rising in recent years. Unemployment rates according to UPS criterion decreased from 3.77 percent in 1987-88 to 2.56 percent in 1993-94 and according to WS from 4.80 percent to 4.28 percent. Unemployment rate by daily status criterion has also shown a decline from 6.09 percent to 6.03 percent over this period. These trends suggest that while the total unemployed labour (in person days as measured by daily status concept) has shown a decline as a percentage of the Labour Force, the percentage of unemployed has increased. In other words, the structure of unemployment seems to be shifting from the predominance of underemployment towards rise in open unemployment.
- 8.6 Within the broad trends towards an increasingly open and chronic character of unemployment the following features may be considered of special significance. For one, this trend is seen to be particularly strong in the case of rural areas, where Usual Status unemployment has decreased from 3.07 percent of Labour Force in 1987-88 to 1.79 percent in 1993-94 and Daily Status unemployment has increased from 5.25 percent to 5.61 percent. In urban areas, only a small change in the open (usual status) unemployment rate was observed from 6.56 to 5.21, so also in the Daily Status unemployment rate from 9.26 to 7.43 percent. Secondly, the trend in the increased incidence of open unemployment was stronger in the case of women than men. The usual status rate of unemployment decreased from 3.52 in 1987-88 to 1.40 percent in 1993-94 among rural women workers but the decrease in the case of rural male workers was from 2.87 to 1.96 percent. In the urban areas also, the open unemployment rate decreased in the case of women and men. Thirdly, the differences between the usual status and daily status unemployment rates were almost same in the case of women and in the case of men, which implies that underemployment is in same proportion of overall unemployment in the case of women as in case of men.
- 8.7 The most comprehensive measure of incidence of the unemployment is the one based on the daily status concept, as it includes all the person days of unemployment of those openly unemployed as well as of the underemployed. According to this measure, the unemployment rate in the country during 1993-94 was 6.03% of the labour force as against 6.09% in 1987-88. The unemployment rates (DS), among the major states, was highest in Kerala during 1993-94; the rates were 14.7% and 17.7% in its Rural and Urban areas respectively, the corresponding all India rates being 5.6% and 7.4% in Rural and Urban areas respectively. In this state the rates among males and females were 13.1% and 19.0% in rural and 14.1% and 27.8% respectively, in urban areas. The states followed by Kerala were Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Orissa and Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh has the lowest unemployment rate (3.1% and 4.8%) in rural and urban areas respectively. Next lowest was in Madhya Pradesh, 2.6% and 6.8% in rural and urban areas respectively.

## WORK-SEEKERS

8.8 The number of work-seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges in the country has gone up from 376.31 lakh at the end of March 1997 to 391.87, lakh at the end of March 1998. The number of men and women on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges and the percentage changes over the years are presented in the following Table: -

It may be observed from the Table-22 that there has been an increase in the number of job seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges over the years from 1989 to 1998. The number of work-seekers registered with the Employment Exchanges has gone up from 376.31 lakh at the end of March, 1997 to 391.87 lakh at the end of March, 1998 recording an increase of 4.1%. In the case of male registrants there was an increase of 3.3%, whereas female registrants increased by 7.0% during the period 1997-1998. The number of work seekers at the end of March, 1997 and 1998 by States/UTs is contained in Annexure-XI.

## **DISTRIBUTION OF EDUCATED JOB-SEEKERS**

8.9 All types of persons approaching Employment Exchanges for seeking employment assistance are registered by the Employment Exchanges in accordance with their educational qualification and skills. Educated job seekers i.e. those who are matriculates and above form a significant segment on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges. Providing employment to educated job seekers poses relatively more intricate problem than to those in the uneducated category, as most of the educated people are generally desirous of seeking white-collar jobs. The following Table-23 presents the number of educated job-seekers classified by sex and educational qualifications:

It may be seen from above data that out of total 4985.0 thousand graduate and post-graduate job seekers, 4389.0 thousand were graduates and 596.0 thousand post-graduates at the end of Dec. 1998. As regards women work seekers, out of 1648.0 thousand graduates and post-graduates, 1401.7 thousand were graduates and the remaining 246.3 thousand were post-graduates. Faculty wise analysis of graduate job-seekers reveals that 1759.1 thousand were degree holders in Arts, followed by 784.0 thousand in Science, 700.5 thousand in Commerce and 724.8 thousand in Education. The number of registrants holding degree in Engineering, Agriculture, Medicine and other faculties was much less as compared to registrants holding degree in Arts, Science, Commerce and Education. Faculty-wise composition of women job-seekers reveals that the number of women job-seekers holding degrees in almost all the disciplines had gone up considerably during 1998. Out of 596.0 thousand post-graduate registrants, 303.3 thousand were post-graduate in Arts, 120.0 thousand in Science, 73.5 thousand in Commerce and 60.0 thousand in Education. The number of post-graduate job seekers in the remaining faculties was less as compared to above faculties. Faculty-wise distribution of women post-graduate job seekers reveals that there was an increase in favour of all the disciplines except Medicine where it was static.

### **DISTRIBUTION OF JOB-SEEKERS BY ZONES**

8.11 There were approximately 392 lakh work-seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1998. The total number of educated job seekers as on Dec. 1998 was around 278 lakh.

8.12 The Zonal distribution of total work-seekers as also educated work-seekers borne on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges is shown in the following Table

It may be seen from the above classification of work-seekers that 72.8% of the job-seekers belonged to the fresher categories and therefore these workers are not classified by specific occupations. Of the total job seekers, 8.6% were Professional and Technical workers, 5.6% were Clerical and related workers, 9.9% were Production and Related Workers, Transport Equipment Operators and Labourers; 0.3% Service workers, 2.9% Farmers, Fisherman, Hunters, Loggers and Related workers and 0.1% Administrative and Related workers.

8.14 The registration of job-seekers, vacancies notified and placements effected as per Live Register of Employment Exchanges give an idea about the labour market situation in the country. Data in the Table-27 shows that about 58.2 lakh work-seekers got themselves registered with the Employment Exchanges in the year 1998. A continuing fall in the number of vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges by various employers over the last ten years from 1989 to 1998 is observed. The number of registrants placed in suitable employment has also shown a declining trend.

### **VACANCIES NOTIFIED BY BROAD OCCUPATIONS**

It will be seen from the above data that out of 359 thousand vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges 76.9 thousand (21.4%) were meant for Professional & Technical workers, 86.4 thousand (24.1%) for Production and Related Workers and Transport Equipment Operators, 42.9 thousand (11.9%) to Clerical and Sales Workers (excluding Typists), 2.4 thousand (0.7%) for Service workers. Around (41.3%) 148.6 thousand vacancies belonged to other occupational categories.

It may be observed from the data contained in the Table-29 that the proportion of vacancies open to freshers decreased from 56.4% during 1997 to 40.7% during 1998. Among the Faculties, the proportion of vacancies open to freshers to the total vacancies notified was the highest in Social Sciences (48.0%) followed by Medicine (39.9%), Technology (32.5%), Natural Science (28.5%), Engineering (28.3%) and Agriculture (24.1%).

## **JOB SEEKERS OF SPECIAL CATEGORIES**

8.17 Large number of women, scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and physically handicapped persons are on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges, as may be seen from Table.

Data in the table above shows that the number of Scheduled Tribes Job seekers in 1998 had gone up by (7.5%) followed by Physically handicapped (5.8%), women job seekers (5.5%) and Scheduled Castes (3.1%) in the year 1998 over the years 1997.

It may be noticed from data in the Table above that at the end of Dec. 1998 there were 58.0 lakh Scheduled Caste job seekers and 17.1 lakh Scheduled Tribe job seekers on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges. The number of S.C. job seekers recorded an increase of 3.1% and the number of S.T. job seekers increased by 7.5% in 1998 over 1997. The large chunks of such work-seekers were matriculates followed by below matriculate (including illiterates). The number of vacancies filled by Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes recorded a declining Trend of 15.4% & 28.4% respectively during 1997-98.

## WOMEN WORK-SEEKERS

It would be seen from above data that the percentage placement of women to the total female registrants during 1989-1998 was in the range of 2.7% to 4.0%. In fact the data in the above table indicates almost a declining tendency in the number of women placements between 1989 and 1998. It has declined from 50.5 thousand in 1989 to 42.0 thousand in 1998. However placement of women has recorded an increase in 1997 at 61.5 thousand, whereas placement of women has decreased in 1998 at 42.0 thousand.

Whereas the percentage of placement to registration in respect of un-educated (below matriculation) was 4.7
